Classes 1-8

Grains

All samples to be deposited at the show office no later than 5pm Friday 8th September 2017 to enable the samples to be analysed and results displayed with grain samples for judging purposes. Special note of thanks to Viterra and Alysha Eckert for assisting with grain analysis.

- 1 Wheat A.S.W. to be correctly named not less than 2kg
- 2 Wheat hard variety to be correctly named not less than 2 kg
- 3 Oats, any variety to be correctly named not less than 2kg
- 4 Barley malting two row type, variety to be correctly named not less than 2kg
- 5 Barley any other two row, not malting variety, to be correctly named not less than 2kg
- 6 Legume, any variety to be correctly named, not less than 2kg
- 7 Canola, any variety to be correctly named, not less than 2kg
- 8 Any other grain variety to be correctly named, not less than 2kg

Classes 9-16

Hay & Conserved Fodder

Samples for analysis will be taken by representatives from Platinum Ag Services in the fortnight before the show and sent off for analysis. Results will be displayed for judging purposes. An indicative sample will be retained by the sampler in the form of plastic sample bag and this will be used as your exhibit for the showing day.

- 9 Oaten Hay
- 10 Wheaten Hay
- 11 Barley Hay
- 13 Meadow Hay
- 14 Lucerne Hay
- 15 Cereal Vetch Hay with varieties of plants desired.
- 16 Any other variety of Hay or Conserved Fodder mixed or single species but must be clearly identified what the desired mix is.

Classes 17 – 26

Production Plants

All plants to be displayed in a sheaf with roots still attached to enable visual assessment of the entire plant health. Samples must be staged at the section no later than 9am Friday 22nd September 2017.

- 17 Green Wheat, 1 sheaf with roots, 15 cm diameter where tied, variety to be correctly named.
- 18 Green Oats, 1 sheaf with roots, 15 cm diameter where tied, to be correctly named.
- 19 Green Barley, 1 sheaf with roots, 15 cm diameter where tied, variety to be correctly named.
- 20 Any other variety Cereal, 1 sheaf with roots, 15 cm diameter where tied, variety to be correctly named.
- 21 Green Lucerne, 1 bundle, 15cm diameter where tied, variety to be correctly named
- 22 Canola, 1 bundle, 15cm diameter where tied, variety to be correctly named

- 23 Peas, 1 bundle, 15cm diameter where tied, variety to be correctly named
- 24 Lupins, 1 bundle, 15cm diameter where tied , variety to be correctly named
- 25 Any other legume, 1 bundle, 15cm diameter where tied , variety to be correctly named
- 26 Any other production plant, 1 bundle, 15cm diameter where tied , variety to be correctly named and the production purpose identified
