CLASS 1 – OPEN AGE

- 1 Any spindle woodturning
- 2 Wooden box not turned
- 3 Scroll sawn or intarsia object
- 4 Wooden toy or model (80% wood composition)
- 5 Pyrography (80% wood composition)
- 6 Turned object utilising a woodturning chuck
- 7 Any other wooden item (80% wood composition)

CLASS 2 – JUNIOR SECTION - (*Under 16 years as of the 1st day of the Murray Bridge Show*)

Entry forms must be signed by parent, guardian or teacher stating that the work entered is the original and unaided work of the exhibitor

- 1 Any other wooden item (80% wood composition)

Rules and Conditions of Entry:

No more than two entries per class may be submitted unless otherwise stated.

If the number of exhibits exceeds the space available, the Society reserves the right to display prize winning exhibits only.

- In all Classes an exhibit can only compete in one class.
- Exhibits must be solely the work of the Individual
- Exhibitors entering group/collaborative classes must nominate one name only as a representative on the entry form.
- No exhibit which is known to have been entered at a previous Murray Bridge Show will be accepted.
- The Society will not accept responsibility for any exhibit entered in a wrong class.
- The Society will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss, damage to, or miss-delivery of any exhibit.
- The judges are empowered to award a prize, whether there be one or more exhibits, providing they deem the exhibit worthy.
- They may award second prize in lieu of first or third prize in lieu of second.
- The judge's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered in to.
- Every separate article of a set must bear the exhibit number and be attached to the set.
- Exhibits must not have any identification markings or names displayed prior to judging, following judging then revert to the exhibit cards supplied by the Society.

Judging:

Two Judges (head and assistant) will independently assess entries on the following merit aligned points criteria

Form and Function	5 Points
Finish	5 Points
Complexity	5 Points
Design and originality	5 Points

Total maximum points 20.

Judges will after independently assess entries, come together and discuss. Overall placings will be determined and an assessment criteria will occur to determine Merit Awards and Show Champion.

Ribbon's for 1st to 3rd will apply in colours (Blue, Red and White) A Merit Certificate will be used for both Junior and open classes as well as a Show Champion Certificate for overall best in show.
