The advertising of any items for sale or the displaying of business cards or other advertising material within the Mr Ken Wells Pavilion is strictly prohibited by law.

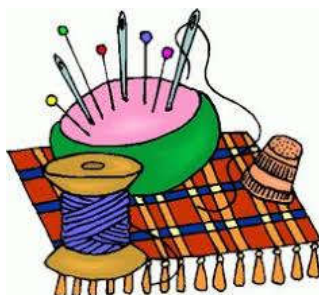
The sale of goods at the show is available to those who purchase a trade site.

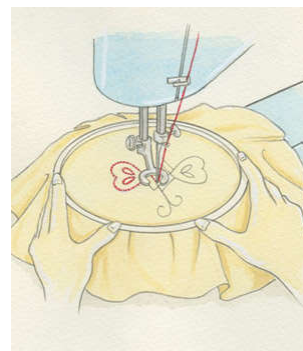
